The tour will offer the visitors the chance to experience its unique history. We will visit the Archaeological Museum of Thessaloniki, which after a period of renovation work is opening its doors to the public. The Archaeological Museum is the biggest museum of Macedonia and through its exhibitions presents various aspects of culture which developed in Macedonia, primarily in the Thessaloniki area and neighboring prefectures over a long chronological period: from the dawn of prehistory until late antiquity, till the first Christian Centuries. The museum presentations are entirely human-centered, re-creating the life and times of the people who lived in this part of Greece. How did they dress? What did they eat? How did they travel? What gods did they worship? How did they memorialize their dead? How they were socially and politically organized? With whom were they in contact exchanging objects and ideas?



Five thematic exhibitions compose the new display proposal by the Archaeological Museum of Thessaloniki.

- 5.000, 15.000, 200.000 years ago...  
An exhibition about life in prehistoric Macedonia
- Towards the birth of cities
- In Macedonia from the 7th BC until the late antiquity
- Thessaloniki, The metropolis of Macedonia
- The Gold of Macedon

Through these, the visitor will come in contact with the world of Ancient Macedonia with its civilization and its people.

Afterwards we will stop at the **White Tower** one of the greatest monuments of the city.

Outstanding tombs of the Roman period, such as the monument of Galerius, the arch of triumph and the Rotonta are our next visit.

**A short break will follow at a traditional café** and then a drop by to the Byzantine church "**Saint Demetrios**", the patron saint of our city.

The completion of tour will be at the arch forum and at the church "**Agia Sofia**".

### ● VERGINA

**Sunday, September 28, 2008**

Modern Vergina is a small and attractive village close to Veria, and home to one of Greece's most important archaeological sites. The ancient city lies at the feet of Pieria, site of Aiges, the ancient capital of the Kingdom of Lower Macedonia, identified by historians with the city of Vergina.

The first graves of important figures were found in the 1950s and 1960s, culminating with the discovery of the royal graves in the great mound, uncovered in 1977. We shall have the opportunity to see the excavation area, the extensive cemetery site and the remarkable Macedonian tombs—among them the most important, the burial place of King Philip II (336 BC) still intact and untouched by grave robbers. Close by lies the royal tomb of Alexander IV (310 BC). The tombs were decorated with brilliant frescos and the finds from within them are now kept and displayed for visitors to marvel at the Vergina Museum. As well as the royal tombs, we shall, also, see the palace and theater, the Temple of Eukleia, with the votive offerings of Queen Euridice, grandmother of Alexander the Great, the Acropolis and the city walls.

Mount Athos is situated in the entire third, eastern and most beautiful peninsula of Halkidiki, called the peninsula of Athos. It is the only

place in Greece that is completely dedicated to prayer and worship of God. For this reason, it is called the Holy Mount. Even today, approximately 1.700 Monks still live there under strict rule, with no women ever being allowed to set foot there.

The natural beauty of the peninsula is extraordinary. The highest point of Mount Athos is like a huge cone, reaching 2033 meters in height. It's a naked, treeless crest that seems to lance the sky and its slopes are fully covered by ancient evergreens. All these help to create an area of incomparable natural beauty.

Most of the monasteries are along the coastal lands and consist of a quadrangle of buildings enclosing a church. The churches contain some of the finest examples of Byzantine art, icons and treasure.

At 9.30 am we will depart from Ormos Panagias and we will have the chance -being onboard- to admire from a slight distance the Monasteries of the West coast of Mount Athos: Dohariou, Xenofontos, Dionisiou, Simonos Petra, Panteleimonos, Agiou Grigoriou, the port of Dafnis, Agiou Paulou and Agia Anna.

At 13.30 pm we are going to anchor to Ouranoupolis for about 2 hours in order to visit the ancient tower of Ouranoupolis, to visit local shops and enjoy a traditional meal
